We are seeking a seasoned Program & Compliance Manager to lead complex defense program execution, manage federal and state compliance, and drive critical minerals initiatives and relationships with the Industrial Base. This role serves as the primary point of contact with multiple third party technical and government partners as well as potential downstream users, to ensure delivery excellence, reporting accuracy, and stakeholder alignment. The ideal candidate blends program management rigor, government contracting competence, and supply-chain risk acumen in critical minerals.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Program Management

- Serve as POC with Idaho National Lab, South Dakota partners, and Hazen for DOTC program activities.
- Act as POC with the U.S. Army and ATI (or equivalent consortium administrator).
- Own program reporting deliverables (Army/ATI) including schedule, performance metrics, risk logs, and contract compliance.
- Manage program budget, invoices, funding profiles, and variance analysis; support audits as needed.
- Lead strategic planning, roadmap development, and next steps recommendations tied to program milestones.

DOW Compliance

- Manage all Department of War reporting and ongoing compliance obligations.
- Own all Department of War requirements, submissions, attestations, and timely reporting.
- Coordinate security clearance discussions and documentation with internal/security leads and external agencies.
- Oversee Department of War security controls and internal compliance requirements; maintain audit-readiness.

EXIM Compliance

- Provide EXIM Bank reporting support, including loan covenants, progress updates, and any compliance documentation required by export financing arrangements.

Critical Minerals (Antimony & Tungsten)

- Lead Antimony RFP support, including proposal development, compliance matrices, pricing inputs, and partner coordination.
- Manage Antimony partner collaboration and performance tracking, drive meetings, actions, and deliverables.
- Conduct/coordinate Tungsten study and report (market intel, supply risk, technical applicability, and cost modeling).

- Support Tungsten-related DOW engagements, requirements mapping, and reporting deliverables.
- Represent the company in DOW settings—build relationships and deliver external presentations.
- Manage and represent PRI relationships with Defense organizations (Cornerstone/DOTC/ATI), ensuring alignment and consistent messaging.

Supply Chain Support

- Support Supply Chain leadership on critical minerals sourcing, availability, tariffs, and logistics constraints.
- Lead tariff/supplies risk assessment, tracking, and management, recommending mitigation strategies (dual sourcing, inventory buffers, contractual terms).

- Experience with DPA, DOW/OSC, and EXIM reporting/compliance frameworks.
- Familiarity with critical minerals (Antimony, Tungsten) supply chains, market dynamics, and industrial applications a strong plus.
- Financial acumen: budgets, invoicing, cost controls, and audit support.
- Excellent communication skills; confident presenting to external stakeholders and government audiences.
- Strong analytical/problem-solving skills and ability to synthesize technical, regulatory, and business considerations.
